## III. MCOM Update: Education, Research and Clinical Care – Dr. Lockwood

Dr. Lockwood thanked everyone for efforts during Hurricane Irma.

**MCOM Applications:** Number of applicants have increased by 60% over the past four years. 6,358 applications in 2017.

MCOM MCAT Percentile rank: From 78 in 2013 to 92 to 2017.

**Mean Scores USMLE Step 1 Exam Scores** (becomes the MCAT scores for Residency programs) Increased from 218 in 2014 to 231.28 in 2019. USMLE Step 2 CK Scores are higher than the national average.

**Curriculum Mapping:** Creation of Apian platform to map curriculum for better curriculum management. 2016-2017 –Technology created; 2017-2018 Curriculum mapped to course and program objectives, and national content objectives; 2018 – 2019 Review AY17/18 for gaps and redundancies.

**MCOM Faculty Research Funding:** Total MCOM research funding 2017 - \$220.3 million. Up from \$127.5 million in 2014.

MCOM Contract & Grant Expenditures: Total: \$110.8 million for 2017.

MCOM NIH Funding: \$75.8 million (\$17.9M for MCOM, \$57.8M Krischner labs)

**NIH Funded Hires in past 18 months:** 11 faculty members in the following Departments: Cardiovascular Sciences, Internal Medicine, Molecular Medicine, Molecular Pharm & Physiology, Obstetrics and Gynecology and Pediatrcs.

**USN&WR Best Research Medical School Rankings:** From 79 in 2015 to 56 in 2017.

**USF Health Care Patient Volume:** From FY15 – 786,049 to FY 17 – 934,373.
