South Carolina Data

ROI Medicaid IPI Data for Unintended Pregnancies


- There were 984 patients with a LARC inserted in FY2014
- Over a 21-month period after FY2014, those patients had a pregnancy rate 5.65 percent lower, which resulted in 52 avoided pregnancies
- A conservative estimate of maternal delivery cost savings, between 1/2012 and 5/2015, is \$1,742,391

"Pre-Implementation Phase focuses on creating and modifying hospital systems to enable acquisition and availability of and reimbursement of immediate postpartum LARC placement."

Process & Structural Measures are meant to guide, measure & prepare your hospital for implementation

Project Lead Role

The Project Lead will need to:


- Organize and encourage collaboration across departments
- Report monthly data by the 7th of the following month
- Discuss hospital score card and the initiative-wide report with team members
- Participate in the Access LARC webinars

FPQC role

FPQC will provide:

- Monthly hospital score card and initiative-wide report
- Access LARC QI materials and tools
- Consultation & assistance by phone or e-mail, as requested
- Periodic Webinars

Access LARC Data Reporting



"WHAT GETS MEASURED GETS MANAGED"

Monthly Data Submission

Hospital Report:

- Simple monthly reporting
- Enter monthly data by the 7th of the following month
- Report until pre-implementation stage is complete
- Hospital Lead will receive a <u>hyperlink</u> from FPQC to access a survey and submit data

Data Collection Form

- Includes all the questions to be reported monthly (PDF format)
- Helps guide monthly activities






Monthly Data Reports

Hospitals Receive:

- Nice-looking one-page hospital score card
- Access LARC Initiative-wide report for comparison
- Received both reports no later than the 15th of the following month
 - For example: January data should be entered by February 7th and the reports should be received by February 15th






Cumulative percent of staff educated on importance of offering immediate postpartum LARC





- Transition to Implementation Phase once:
 - LARC devices are in the hospital formulary
 - Billing codes have been established and tested for LARC devices
 - LARC devices and ancillary equipment are available at delivery sites and/or postpartum unit

Implementation Phase Reports

- Ready for submission when your hospital is ready
- Different hospital and initiative reports
- Monthly submission through a different data portal
 - Structural measures—one time changes
 - Process measures—patient and provider education
 - Outcome measures—percent of participating hospitals providing immediate postpartum LARC and numbers of LARCs inserted
