Impact |An Intramural Review to Support Research and Scientific Publication was launched in the Department of Internal Medicine in 2017 by Editor-in-Chief Richard F. Lockey, MD. In the past few years, it has expanded throughout USF Health and its affiliate institutions.

Impact provides an avenue for medical, graduate and post-graduate students, residents, fellows, and faculty to receive assistance at any stage of the scientific writing process.

This is accomplished in two ways:

1. **The website, impact.health.usf.edu**, is a repository of writing resources designed to assist authors at any stage of writing abstracts, case reports, posters, reviews, scientific articles and book chapters. It includes both USF and outside links in a centralized site that is easy to navigate.
2. **Hands-on writing support through intramural peer-review.** Once an author has finished a manuscript they can submit it via an online form on *Impact*'s website to have it reviewed by faculty editors. The Editors provide feedback on the quality and clarity of the presentation, structure, language and content of a manuscript.

Impact fosters cooperation and collaboration in writing and helps feed the pipeline for tomorrow's leaders in academic medicine.
