About Dr. Alla Solyar, MD:

Dr. Alla Solyar is a board-certified otolaryngologist with subspecialty training in Rhinology and Skull Base Surgery.

She was born in Moscow, Russia, and moved with her family to the United States in 1990. She is a graduate of Brandeis University (magna cum laude & Phi Beta Kappa) and completed her medical school and residency training at Albert Einstein College of Medicine. She completed her rhinology fellowship training at the Sinus & Nasal Institute of Florida (SNI) under the mentorship of Dr. Donald Lanza in 2011. She returned to SNI in 2013 and has been treating patients with complex sinus and nasal disorders including sinusitis, nasal/sinus tumors, and cerebrospinal fluid leaks.

Dr. Solyar has presented her clinical studies at multiple state, national and international meetings. She is a co-author of multiple book chapters in rhinology literature including “Nasal & Paranasal Sinus Anatomy & Embryology,” “Computer Assistance in Sinus Surgery,” and “Anti-Inflammatory Therapy in Sinusitis.” Her publications in peer-reviewed literature include a range of rhinology topics, including atypical mycobacterial related sinusitis, management of cerebrospinal fluid leaks, and endoscopic sinus surgery simulation.

Dr. Solyar is an active member of the American Rhinologic Society, American Academy of Otolaryngic Allergy, and American Academy of Otolaryngology-Head and Neck Surgery. She has been serving on the St. Anthony’s Hospital CME Committee since 2014. Her other administrative duties include running a monthly otolaryngology journal club.

On a personal note, she is a proud mother of two children, Frida (8) and Aaron (6). Her husband is a University of Tampa professor who studies aquatic vision. In her free time, she likes to spend time with her family, cook and read.
