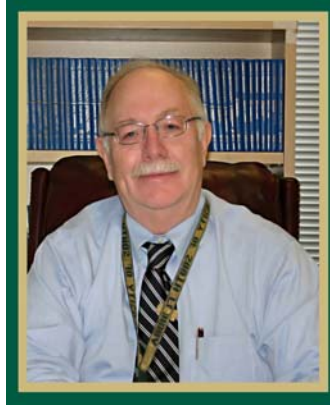


A Message from the Chairman

New Faculty: Dr. Angel Luciano, Assistant Professor



Dr. Luciano served on the faculty at the University of Florida after completing his training in pediatrics, neonatology and a post-doctoral research fellowship in immunology.

In 2008 he joined the faculty at Case Western Reserve University-Rainbow Babies and Children's Hospital in Cleveland, Ohio. While in Ohio, Dr. Luciano served as Assistant Professor of Pediatrics, teacher of the Medical Spanish Course for medical students in the CWRU-School of Medicine Applied Medical Spanish Program, and was a member of the Committee for the Neonatology-Physiology Core Curriculum Development. Dr. Luciano re-located to Tampa to continue his research in developmental immunology.

Dr. Luciano has an interest in academic medicine, including the teaching of medical students, residents and fellows. His primary scholarly interests include the role of intrauterine exposure to bacterial products and its effects on the development of the immune system in premature infants. He is also interested in the role of bacterial translocation in HIV infection.

New Faculty: Dr. Ronald Sutsko, Assistant Professor



Dr. Sutsko graduated from the Philadelphia College of Osteopathic Medicine, and subsequently, did his residency training through University of Medicine and Dentistry, New Jersey - School of Osteopathic Medicine at Cooper University Hospital in Camden, NJ. He completed his neonatology fellowship training in 2010 at Jackson Memorial Hospital/University of Miami Miller School of Medicine.

His basic science research focused on the use of stem cells in the treatment of chronic lung disease, a project for which he was awarded an "Advancing Newborn Medicine Grant". His other interests include medical education, neonatal transport, and medical ethics. Dr. Sutsko is Board Certified in Pediatrics, and Board Eligible in Neonatology.

Association for Asthma Educators Annual Conference July 2010

Dr. Sleasman was invited to speak on the "Overview of Immunodeficiency" at the Association for Asthma Educators (AAE) Annual Conference in Orlando, FL on July 31, 2010.

The Association for Asthma Educators was founded in 1998 and is a non-profit organization dedicated to providing quality education to a mul-

tidisciplinary group of asthma educators.

AAE's membership includes nurses, nurse practitioners, respiratory therapists, pharmacists, doctors, physician assistants, community health workers, case managers and social workers.

The primary purpose of the AAE is to promote asthma education as an integral comprehensive asthma program, to raise the competence of health care pro-

fessionals who educate individuals and families affected by asthma, and to raise the standard of care and quality of asthma education delivered to those with asthma.

The 2010 Association of Asthma Educators conference featured more than 20 speakers covering a variety of asthma education topics.

The National Institutes of Health (NIH) National Center for Research Resources has awarded USF Health a K30 Clinical Research Curriculum Award entitled "USF Scholars in Patient-Oriented Research (SPOR)" to support the development of careers in

clinical and translational research for physician-scientists and other multidisciplinary patient-oriented researchers.

The K30 Grant supports the development and implementation of a two-year didactic and mentored research curriculum for M.D., Ph.D. and first profes-

The Pediatric Allergy/Immunology Program has established a new orientation for incoming USF Allergy and Immunology Fellows called “Fellow Boot Camp”. On July 9th our starting fellows Doanh Nguyen, MD and Araceli Elizalde, MD were joined by

our Outpatient Care Center nurses and medical assistants and the Allergy/Immunology fellows from the Tampa program for an afternoon of learning.

This format gives an annual formal opportunity for faculty to review the latest developments in clinical Allergy

and Immunology, and then present to fellows and clinic staff any updates on routine clinical procedures and approaches to management in order to continue to provide state of the art care for our patients.

International Obsessive Compulsive Disorders Foundation

Drs. Tanya Murphy, Eric Storch and Adam Lewin attended the 17th Annual International Obsessive Compulsive Disorder Foundation (IOCDF) conference in Washington, DC from July 15-18, 2010. Obsessive Compulsive Disorder (OCD) is a disorder of the brain and behavior which causes severe anxiety in those affected. The IOCDF is an international not-for-profit organization made up of people with OCD and related disorders, as well as their families, friends, professionals and others.

The mission and goals of the IOCDF are to educate the public and professionals about OCD in order to raise awareness and improve the quality of treatment provided; support research into the cause of, and effective treatments for, OCD and related disorders; improve access to resources for those with OCD and their families; advocate and lobby for the OCD community.

IOCDF was founded by a group of people with OCD in 1986 and since 1993 the annual IOCDF Confer-

ence has been the only national meeting focused solely on OCD and OC related disorders. The unique event allows people with OCD and their loved ones to experience the latest OCD information alongside of the mental health professionals who care for them. There were over 100 presentations (Drs. Murphy, Storch, and Lewin gave 7 of these!), workshops, and seminars as well as more than a dozen support groups. The presenters include some of the most experienced and knowledgeable clinicians and researchers in the field, as well as people with OCD and family members who are willing to share their story.

USF faculty are among the most innovative and knowledgeable researchers in the field of OCD and OC related disorders. Dr. Adam Lewin recently received a \$24,971 award from IOCDF for his research project entitled "Neuro-Executive Predictors of Cognitive Behavioral Treatment Response in Youth with OCD". Drs. Murphy and Storch

have both received past IOCDF grants for their work in OCD, in addition to a long history of NIH funding in this area.

Dr. Storch is a member of the Scientific Advisory Board of the IOCDF.

Following the conference, Drs. Murphy and Storch were invited to attend and participate in a two day conference on PANDAS (Pediatric Autoimmune Neuropsychiatric Disorders Associated with Streptococcal infections) at the National Institute of Health (NIH) from July 18-19, 2010. Only a selective group of clinicians and researchers were invited to attend this conference where Dr. Murphy presented her cutting edge research. The conference objectives were to determine the utility of the PANDAS criteria; discuss a new neuropsychiatric scale to help diagnose the disorder; discuss various treatment methodologies employed by the presenting physicians/clinicians in their work and those used in existing research; and examine the symptom criteria used in recent research and how it relates to the PANDAS criteria and recent clinical experiences.

Special Presentations

Dr. Sleasman was invited as an expert member of the United States and European Expert Panel discussion on the therapeutic uses of immune globulin sponsored by the journal *Dialogues* in New York City on July 27, 2010.

Dr. Sleasman presented on the *Use and Abuse of Intravenous Immune Globulin Therapy* at the Tennessee Asthma, Allergy, and Immunology Society Annual Conference in Nashville, TN in July 2010.

Dr. Morna Dorsey presented on the *Immunologic Mechanisms of Atopic Dermatitis* at the All Children's Hospital Grand Rounds on July 9, 2010.
