

### **A. Migrant and Seasonal Farmworker Rights/Lifestyle Issues Criteria**

The article must meet the following conditions:

The article includes content related to any aspect of the legal or personal rights, or lifestyle issues of the migrant and seasonal farmworker population (MSF).

**“Lifestyle Issues”** refers to any aspect of the living conditions of the MSF populations, including housing, poverty, transportation, transiency/frequent mobility, working conditions, language barriers, etc.

- These articles may be related to legal rights pertaining to citizenship of the MSF or family members.
- These articles may be related to the Migrant and Seasonal Agricultural Workers Protection Act.
- These articles may be related to the Fair Labor Standards Act or labor issues in general for the MSF.
- These articles may be related to wages of the MSF.
- These articles may be related to describing or reporting work conditions of the MSF population (i.e. long hours, exposure to the elements, mobility, etc.).
- These articles may be related to housing issues of the MSF population.
- These articles may be related to transportation issues of the MSF population.
- These articles may be related to educational issues of the MSF and their family members.
- These articles may be related to insurance issues of the MSF.
- These articles may be related to the nature of the work that MSF perform.
- These articles may be reporting local or statewide harvest conditions/expectations and their relationship to the MSF population.
- These articles may be related to reporting the outcome of meetings held to discuss MSF rights or lifestyle issues.
- These articles may be related to legislative action on behalf of the MSF population.
- These articles may be related to actions taken by opposing groups of the MSF (i.e. growers, packing houses, etc.).
- These articles may be related to describing intervention efforts targeting MSF rights or lifestyle issues.
- These articles may be related to reporting activities of groups advocating on behalf of the MSF population (i.e. picketing activities for higher wages, etc.).
- Items appropriate for this section also include editorials, cartoons appearing as part of news/event coverage (and not on the cartoon page), and photographs related to the MSF population.

AND

The article is NOT one of the following:

- Part of a classified ad.
- An advertisement of any kind.
- Part of the comic strips located in the cartoon section.
- Part of any tables and listings of stock and commodities prices.
- A recipe or school lunch menu.
- Part of a movie review.
- Part of a funeral or engagement announcement.
- Part of an obituary.
- An announcement of an event (providing only date, location, and time).

## **B. Health Issues of Migrant and Seasonal Farmworkers Criteria**

The article must meet the following conditions:

The article includes content related to any aspect of the health of migrant and seasonal farmworkers.

“**Health**” refers to any aspect of the physical, oral, social, psychological, and occupational health of the MSF and/or their children, and includes health prevention, health promotion, and intervention.

- These articles may be related to specific health conditions of MSF (including child workers).
- These articles may be related to specific health conditions of children or other family members of the MSF.
- These articles may be related to health consequences of migrant and seasonal farmwork.
- These articles may be related to occupational health hazards of the MSF population.
- These articles may be related to predictors of health in MSF and family members.
- These articles may be related to predictors or correlates of health consequences of MSF and family members.
- These articles may be related to defining or overcoming barriers to access of healthcare in the MSF population.
- These articles may be related to cultural issues in healthcare of the MSF population.
- These articles may report on use of the local Migrant Health Clinic.

AND

The article is NOT one of the following:

- Part of a classified ad.
- An advertisement of any kind.
- Part of the comic strips located in the cartoon section.
- Part of any tables and listings of stock and commodities prices.
- A recipe or school lunch menu.
- Part of a movie review.
- Part of a funeral or engagement announcement.
- Part of an obituary.
- An announcement of an event (providing only date, location, and time).

### **C. Migrant and Seasonal Farmworkers Community Capacity Criteria**

The article must meet the following conditions;

The article includes content related to any aspect of COMMUNITY CAPACITY, COMMUNITY COALITIONS, COMMUNITY EMPOWERMENT, COMMUNITY PARTICIPATION, or COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT. The content must have *already occurred* and should have a local focus (although state and national articles may be included if they discuss the impact on the local community).

“**Local Focus**” refers to the Immokalee area or the MSF ‘community’ that works in the Immokalee area.

- These articles may be related to factors that contribute to community sustainability:
  - ✓ Articles may report on a catalyst or champion for the community.
  - ✓ Articles may report on community group meetings or events as long as they provide details on who collaborated, who attended, or what outcomes resulted from the event/meeting and do NOT merely report that the event occurred.
  - ✓ Articles may report on community training or education seminars as long as they provide information on the benefits to the community.
  - ✓ Articles may report on the use of community services such as library facilities, recreation centers, etc.
  - ✓ Articles may report on the creation and implementation of new community services as long as they are the result of a collaborative effort and NOT a private, for-profit entity.
  - ✓ Articles may report on the cohesiveness or trust among community members.
  - ✓ Articles may report on fund-raising events as long as they provide information related to the amount of money made, who attended, or any collaboration that occurred and do NOT merely report the date and location of where it occurred.
- These articles may be related to changes in political office or reporting on the politics of the local community as long as the article provides information related to the *impact* of a political officer or policy on the community.
- These articles may be related to community business as long as the articles reports on the social benefits to the community and NOT merely the financial benefits.

The article is NOT one of the following:

- Part of a classified ad.
- An advertisement of any kind.
- Part of the comic strips located in the cartoon section.
- Part of any tables and listings of stock and commodities prices.
- A recipe or school lunch menu.
- Part of a movie review.
- Part of a funeral or engagement announcement.
- Part of an obituary.
- An announcement of an event (providing only date, location, and time).
