Alfonso Campos, MD, USF Pediatric Transplant Nephrologist and co_Director of the Pediatric Kidney Transplant Program at Tampa General Hospital was the recipient of the Thomas Thrasher Award for Excellence at a recent dinner in his honor. The Thomas Thrasher Award of Excellence honors outstanding individual members from the medical community. These outstanding individuals perform their jobs with care and excellence. They excel in their chosen field by demonstrating the ultimate level of medical professionalism.

Dr. Campos attended medical school at the prestigious San Marcos University in Lima, Peru. He then completed his pediatric residency at Michael Reese Hospital, affiliated with the University of Chicago. In 1978, Dr. Campos finished his specialty training at the University of Minnesota as a fellow in pediatric transplant nephrology. The first pediatric hemodialysis program in Tampa was initiated by Dr. Campos in 1982. Only six months later, the first pediatric kidney transplant was performed at Tampa General Hospital. As of July 2008, 160 pediatric kidney transplants have been performed at Tampa General Hospital.

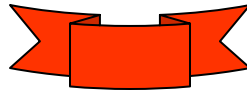
From the Chairman's Desk

USF to join the National Institute of Health's National Children's Study

USF will be taking part in a historic National Children's Study which will look at the interaction of genes and the environment on children's health. The study will span 20 years and incorporate 72 locations across the United States. USF was awarded \$28.8 million for its participation in the oversight of the research contract.

Kathleen O'Rourke, PhD, professor of epidemiology at the USF College of Public Health will lead the NCS study in Hillsborough County with co-leader Lewis Rubin, MD, professor and Muma Endowed Chair in Neonatology at the USF Department of Pediatrics, College of Medicine. She will lead the Orange County study with co-leader David Keefe, MD, professor and chair of USF Obstetrics and Gynecology. Wendy Nembhard, PhD, assistant professor of epidemiology at the USF College of Public Health, will also have a lead role in both counties and will assist in oversight of the research projects and administrative activities.

What: Items of Excellence (IOE) are summaries of wins and accomplishments that support the vision and strategic goals of the HSC, the College and the department – timely items that we would like everyone to know about. Research Really Matters (emphasis on national prominence, interdisciplinary collaboration)

Entrepreneurial Academic Practice (successful clinical practice and community outreach programs/projects, collaborations with community partners-- e.g. TGH, Moffitt, VA, ACH, outpatient sites).

Operational/Financial Innovation (streamlining of clinic operations resulting in greater efficiency and profit – scheduling, patient flow, medical records, billing, etc)

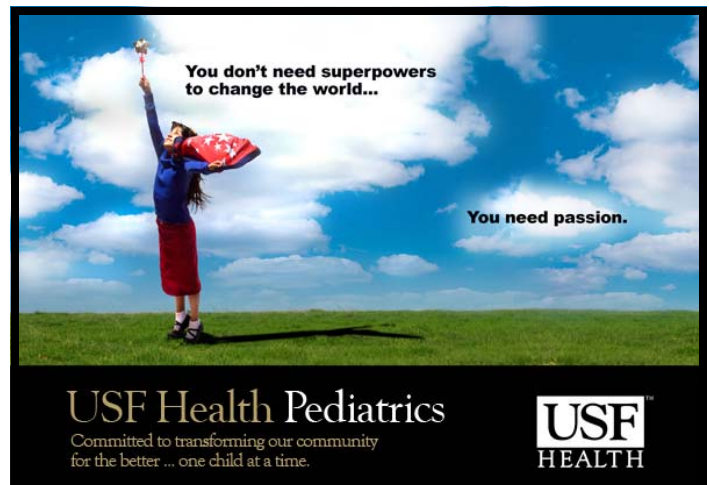
