Ann Winch Fellowship

This non-renewable, \$1,000 stipend is available to graduate students over traditional age, and is based upon community service and demonstrated high academic achievement. Obtain an application form from the Financial Aid office; a curriculum vita or resume, essay and letters of recommendation are required. Please go to <http://www.grad.usf.edu/fellowship.asp>.

Carl A. Gelin Endowed Fellowship: Carl A. Gelin

This scholarship is open to students of the Department of Health Policy and Management. Nominations will be made by the Department of HPM.

Delores A. Auzenne Fellowship

For U.S. minority citizens pursuing a graduate degree in disciplines in which minority students have low representation. Full-time (9 credit hours per semester) required. \$5000 stipend per academic year (\$2500 each semester, Fall and Spring). Awardees are selected by the Auzenne Fellowship Committee.

Awardees must request reconsideration each year. The Auzenne Fellowship is not available for the Summer semester. Continuation of the award is based upon availability of funds and satisfactory academic performance of the student. FEHA Scholarships

Florida Environmental Health Association accepts applications for FEHA Scholarships of \$500 minimum from students whose course of study must be in pursuit of a scientific discipline that relates to a career in environmental health and/or public health. For current information go to www.feha.org.

Florida Linkage Institutes

Each institute is allowed to exempt up to 25 full-time equivalent students per year from the respective host countries to study in any of the state universities or community colleges in this state as resident students for tuition purposes. Foundation Graduate and Presidential Doctoral Fellowships

The USF Foundation established these fellowships to enhance selected areas of interdisciplinary strength. Foundation Fellowships will provide an annual stipend of \$20,000; provide full tuition, fees, and health insurance, and be renewable for up to 5 years. Please note: These tend to be awarded to students who demonstrate an outstanding potential for research. This award is highly competitive based on GRE and GPA as well as departmental recommendation. There is no application form; nominations are made by College departments. These are intended for new, incoming doctoral students. Please go to <http://www.grad.usf.edu/fellowship.asp>.

FPHA Scholarships

Florida Public Health Association accepts applications/nominations for FPHA Scholarships \$500 for MPH or MSPH candidates and \$300 for other health fields. Letters should include: present position, future goals and ambitions, and be FPHA members. For more information go to www.fpha.org.

Graduate Assistantships

Graduate assistants may perform research, teaching functions, assist in the production seminars and workshops, or other work related to their specific disciplines. Graduate assistants are paid a biweekly stipend and may qualify to receive in-state tuition waivers. Assistantships are awarded on a competitive basis. Students must have a GPA of 3.0 or better in their upper division coursework, must be degree-seeking and enrolled full time. Positions are posted at <http://publichealth.usf.edu/jobpostings.html>.

Graduate Educational Opportunity Grants (GEOG)

For full-time, degree seeking African American graduate students at USF. Candidates can be nominated by the Office of Graduate Studies, their respective departments, college or advisors, or can apply directly to the program. The awardee is granted a stipend of up to \$3500 for the Fall and Spring semesters only (\$7000 annually). In addition for each semester the full \$3500 stipend is awarded, the student will be eligible for a tuition waiver of 9 hours. Student fees are not included in the waiver. A maximum of 4 semesters of Fellowship support may be provided to students at the master's level and up to 6 semesters at the doctoral level. The recipient must enroll in and complete at least 9 credit hours per semester. **The GEOG is not available for the Summer semester.** Continuation of the award is based upon availability of funds and satisfactory academic performance of the student. Jose Marti Scholarship Challenge Grant

A need based program for Hispanic American students or those with origins in the Caribbean, Central and South American (regardless of race). Award is \$2,000 per academic year for a maximum of four semesters of fulltime graduate study. Must have a 3.0 GPA for all undergraduate work and demonstrate financial need. The A. Harrison and Ruth Kosove Scholarship Program

The Kosove Scholarship Program makes annual, renewable scholarship awards to undergraduate and graduate students. These awards pay the full cost of Florida-resident tuition, books, Housing and Food Service, or the equivalent costs for students living off-campus. Awards are made for two academic years to graduate students. All new graduate students accepted to Masters, Specialist, or Doctoral programs are eligible to apply. Latin American and Caribbean Scholarships

Students from Latin America and the Caribbean (including Puerto Rico and the US Virgin Islands) are eligible to receive LAC scholarships at USF. In order to qualify, students must be fully admissible to USF under existing criteria for graduate programs and meet other standards. Scholarship is \$250 per fall and spring semester and student is then eligible for in-state tuition. A minimum GPA of 3.0 is recommended. Full time status of 9 credits per semester is required. Latino Graduate Fellowship (LGF)

This fellowship has been established at the University of South Florida to provide financial assistance to Latino graduate students. Candidates can be nominated by the Office of Graduate Studies, their respective departments, college or advisors, or can apply directly. The awardee is granted a stipend of up to \$3500 for the Fall and Spring semesters only (\$7000 annually). In addition for each semester the full

\$3500 stipend is awarded, the student will be eligible for a tuition waiver of 9 hours. Student fees are not included in the waiver. **Students must request reconsideration each year.** The recipient must enroll in and complete at least 9 credit hours per semester. **The LGF is not available for the Summer semester.** Continuation of the award is based upon availability of funds and satisfactory academic performance of the student. Lea Leavengood Senior Program Endowed Scholarship

This annual scholarship is given to one or two students who have an interest in the field of aging. The amount of this scholarship varies annually. Applications are announced to the student body by email in the fall and an application form with essay is required.

Maternal-Child Health (MCH) Traineeships

Federally funded MCH Traineeships are available to Florida resident and nonresident students admitted to the PhD, MPH or MSPH degree programs in Maternal and Child Health within the Department of Community and Family Health. Traineeships provide student stipends and/or financial assistance toward tuition costs. The availability of MCH Traineeships is dependent on annual funding. Competitive awards are made on the basis of the following criteria: 1) students should hold a degree recognized by his or her own profession as conferring professional status in a MCH relevant field, 2) at least two years of professional experience related to MCH, and 3) career goals consonant with a commitment to MCH. Maternal Child Health Epidemiology Traineeships

This is for doctoral students. Two full-time students are provided stipend and tuition each year. Selection is made by faculty and based on academic qualifications. Call 813-974-4867 for more information.

McKnight Foundation Black Doctoral Fellowship Program

Provides full tuition plus an \$11,000 (\$5,500 per semester) stipend for minority American citizens or permanent residents pursuing a PhD at USF or nine other Florida universities. NIOSH Traineeships

The National Institute of Occupational Safety and Health offers traineeships to accepted students in the Industrial Hygiene/Safety Management program. The traineeship award includes a tuition waiver for nine credits per semester as well as a stipend. Richard F. Pride Research Fellowship

Established by the Research Council of the University of South Florida (USF), this Fellowship is designed to address the under-representation of minorities in the state's colleges and universities by providing highly qualified candidates with the opportunity to engage in advanced study leading to the Doctor of Philosophy degree at USF. It is offered on a competitive basis to individuals who are citizens of the U.S. While members of all minority groups are invited to apply, special consideration will be given to African Americans. It will provide an annual stipend of \$20,000 for up to four (4) calendar years and will also grant tuition waivers for up to nine (9) credit hours for the Fall and Spring semesters. Fellowship recipients will be expected to establish in-state residency by the end of the first year. If in-state residency is not established, the recipient will be responsible for paying the out-of-state portion of their fees. Samuel P. Bell III Scholarship

Mr. Bell has a strong interest in health care matters. This scholarship is competitive. Applications are announced to the student body by email in the spring and an application form with essay is required.

Summer Program for Minority Graduate Students

This program is designed to attract and help prepare beginning minority graduate students for study at the University of South Florida. Candidates are nominated by their departments or can apply directly to the program. The awardee is granted a stipend of up to \$1300 for the summer session, must enroll in at least one summer graduate course, and is required to attend weekly workshop sessions involving all aspects of graduate education (about 6 weeks during the summer semester—once per week, sessions are one and one-half to two hours in length). U.S. Public Health Traineeships

The College of Public Health cooperates with the US Public Health Service in offering traineeships to our students. The traineeship award includes a tuition waiver for nine semester hours as well as a stipend for full-time students; part-time students may be eligible for tuition waiver only. The availability of traineeships is entirely dependent on the receipt of federal funds. Awards are made by the Departments to Epidemiology, Biostatistics, Maternal and Child Health, Public Health Education, Environmental Health, Public Health Practice, and Toxicology students. Applicants must be U.S. citizens or permanent residents. Departments award Traineeships each fall.

University Graduate Fellowship (UGF)

Awarded annually on a competitive basis to full time students of outstanding academic potential. Criteria include: GPA of at least 3.5; minimum score of 1250 (verbal + quantitative) on GRE or 580 on GMAT. Award is \$5,250 divided over two consecutive semesters with tuition waiver. Each department selects one new student who receives tuition waiver and a stipend during the fall and spring semester for one year.
