### **PROJECT ANNOUNCEMENTS**

- Thank you for your attendance and support at FPQC's Annual Neonatal Focused Meeting 2014. We had 64 attendees, including neonatologists, nurses, administrators, and state government representatives. Attendees enjoyed the networking and ability to exchange ideas and collaborate across the state.
- Thank you for providing good discussion and feedback regarding the topic of our next neonatal project at the FPQC meeting. We will be sending out a survey in the next month to evaluate your interest so that we can pursue development of our next collaborative project.
- FPQC's Golden Hour project completes required data collection on 12/31/14 (not 11/30/14, as previously stated). For those sites who joined later or who are interested in continuing to submit data, the database will be open until 3/31/15 and the last available data reports will be generated to include that data.
- FPQC will be working on formatting the Golden Hour toolkit we developed to share with all of our members. We hope to have this completed by 1/2015.

## **CURRENT ACTION ITEMS FOR HOSPITAL TEAMS**

- We are noticing an initiative-wide decline in compliance with a number of measures.
  - Consider providing incentives to improve your Golden Hour team's efforts. Several sites have had success with rewarding teams with 100% compliance with goals using bulletin board postings, certificates and candy bars, and email notification.
  - Being engaged with your site is important. Evaluate your site's performance by reviewing your data report with the core team as well as other team members. After reviewing your data reports, discuss your site's goals for the month to determine your next change cycle.
  - As we are nearing the end of our collaborative effort, consider the interventions your site has made and methods to continue and maintain your site's success.
