Damian Stanziano applied for the Sam Bell and the Rita Bruce Scholarships but has not specifically applied for the Lee Leavengood Scholarship. However, the committee recommends awarding him the Lee Leavengood Scholarship because he meets the requirements for this award, and was not rated highly to receive either of the scholarships for which he applied.

Since only students in the Department of Health Policy & Management are eligible to receive the Carl Gelin Scholarship, the committee proposes that the applicants for this Scholarship be evaluated and a recipient recommended within the Department of Health Policy & Management, rather than by the College Student Affairs Committee.
