

# **Course Description**

One of the greatest challenges for the practicing urologist is staying abreast of the latest advances in the field. This course is designed for practicing urologists who are interested in updating their knowledge in the diagnosis, evaluation and management of urologic problems. Distinguished faculty will present advances in the management of urological disease; including sexual function, uro-oncology, laparoendoscopic single-site surgery, robotic and reconstruction surgery with a strong emphasis on the technical aspects of various urological procedures. There will be ample time for questions and answers.

# Objectives Upon completion of this program, participants should be able to:

- **Summarize** strategies to implement quality improvement and patient safety in <u>Urology</u>.
- Analyze the best approach for renal decompression for infected calculus.
- Summarize the optimal management of medium-sized renal stones including medical management of nephrolithiasis.
- Describe evidence-based management of reconstructive urology patients.
- Describe the role of prostate cancer vaccines.
- Determine the role of radical prostatectomy for high risk disease and guidelines for prostate cancer screening.
- Compare and contrast surgery treatment options in urinary diversion vs. cutaneous ureterostomy.

- Optimize treatments for bladder neck contracture following radical prostatectomy.
- *Identify* the role of cosmetic urology.
- Describe how to prevent and manage complications of partial nephrectomy.
- Summarize controversies in Testosterone Therapy.
- *Identify* current clinical management of Orchalgia.
- Recognize the role of neoadjuvant and adjuvant chemotherapy for muscle invasive bladder cancer.
- Analyze the use of endourological management of upper tract urothelial carcinoma.
- **Discuss** intravesical therapies for non-muscle invasive bladder cancer.
- Describe how to best evaluate and manage adrenal masses.


