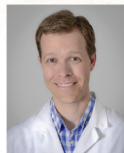

Course Description

One of the greatest challenges for the practicing urologist is staying abreast of the latest advances in the field. This course is designed for the practicing urologists who are interested in updating their knowledge in the diagnosis, evaluation and management of urologic problems. Distinguished faculty will present advances in the management of urological disease; including sexual function, uro-oncology, and case studies in female urology and current concepts in robotic reconstruction with a strong emphasis on the technical aspects of various urological procedures. There will be ample time for questions and answers.

Program Objectives

As a result of participating in this activity, the learner should be able to:

- **Summarize** the options for treatment of patients with pelvic organ prolapse
- **Describe** the factors associated with prevention of sub-urethral sling complications
- **Summarize** the guidelines for artificial urinary sphincter placement
- **Describe** the treatment options for patients with pelvic radiation and bladder symptoms
- **Describe** the workup and management of patients with urethral stricture
- **Determine** the best medical management of patients with nephrolithiasis
- **Compare** differing strategies for renal drainage after PCNL
- **Optimize** treatments for bladder neck contracture following radical prostatectomy
- **Identify** the role of cosmetic urology
- **Describe** ways to minimize infection with penile prosthesis placement
- **Summarize** controversies in testosterone replacement therapy after treatment for prostate cancer
- **Compare and contrast** the new non-muscle-invasive bladder cancer guidelines
- **Recognize** appropriate patients for nephron-sparing surgery in renal cell carcinoma
- **Analyze** the use of endourological management of upper tract urothelial carcinoma
- **Discuss** the indications for cytoreductive nephrectomy
- **Identify** the medico-legal pitfalls of urologic care
