Pilot Randomized Controlled Trial of Jiu Jitsu (JJ) Training versus Conventional Physical Exercise (CPE) Among Male U.S. Service Members and Veterans with Symptoms of Post-Traumatic Stress Disorder (PTSD)

This is a pilot un-blinded randomized controlled trial ($n=30$) of a 5-month Jiu Jitsu (JJ) intervention versus a 5-month Conventional Physical Exercise (CPE) intervention with 1:1 randomization stratified by degree of PTSD symptomatology at study entry. Assessments of psychological and physical health status will occur pre-intervention and at the end of the assigned intervention period (5 months). The primary study objective is to compare efficacy and to estimate the effect size of JJ training versus CPE in reducing mental and physical health symptoms among U.S. service members/veterans with current symptoms of combat-related PTSD.

Autonomic Nervous System and EEG Target Engagement by Use of Accelerated Resolution Therapy for PTSD

This study will investigate *target engagement* of Accelerated Resolution Therapy (ART) in the treatment of post-traumatic stress disorder (PTSD). In the R61 phase, measurement of target

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engagement of ART in the treatment of PTSD will occur by randomly assigning 50 patients to treatment with ($n=25$) vs. without ($n=25$) use of sets of lateral eye movements. Within- and between-session changes in the autonomic nervous system will be assessed by repeated measures of salivary alpha amylase and cortisol (i.e. acute and semi-acute stress response). If the R61 effort demonstrates target engagement in addition to providing insight into the incremental effect of the eye movement component of the ART protocol, the R33 phase will be dedicated to determining guidelines for optimal clinical delivery of ART (with or without eye movements).

Secondary Data Analyses of Reductions in Stress and Depression in Relation to Measures of Ideal Cardiovascular Health

This project is a secondary data analyses of the Heart Strategies Concentrating on Risk Evaluation (Heart SCORE) study, a longitudinal prospective cohort study of 2,000 western Pennsylvanians (43% black) adults age 45 to 74 at study entry and originally conceived to study and reduce racial disparities in cardiovascular disease. Exploratory Clinical Trial of Accelerated Resolution Therapy for Treatment of Chronic Neuropathic Pain

This study aims to investigate adaptation of Accelerated Resolution Therapy (ART), a brief, evidence-based treatment modality (mind/body) for post-traumatic stress disorder and depression, as a potential future treatment option for patients with chronic, moderate-to-severe, neuropathic pain (NP). The study is designed to identify the most promising delivery features of adaptation of the ART intervention, as well as the most suitable types of patients with NP in which to formally evaluate ART in a full-scale clinical trial as a potential non-pharmacological treatment option for chronic NP.
