The meeting was called to order at 12:00 pm. Unless otherwise noted, all votes were unanimous.

2. General Discussion Items (Mlynarek / Perrin)

• Discussion of POS changes to meet BOG policy Dr. Perrin described the current status of complying with the BOG directives. She distributed a standardized form the each concentration is to complete by September 1. One form per concentration, for all concentrations a department intends to have in fall 2018.

Role of EC in CEPH

Dr. Perrin reminded the committee of the CEPH timeline: January 2018 – College CEPH document due January 2018 – first draft of CEPH document sent for community review; incorporate comments September 2018 – final draft of CEPH document to CEPH October 23, 23, 2018 – CEPH site visit
The EC will be extensively involved in all of these steps, especially the site visit.

3. Continuing Items (Mlynarek / Perrin)

- Student member needed PHSA contacted
 Natasha Kurji has graduated. PHSA has been contacted about soliciting another
 student member
- Curriculum Specialist (Perrin)

 Dr. Perrin said that the curriculum specialist has been hired and will begin soon.

 She informed us of the move of personnel (advisors to the Well, the programs and outcomes group to CPH)
- New syllabus / competency table Dr. Perrin informed each department of its status regarding syllabus / competency table completion. Most required courses have been completed, but may other courses have not. The data entry positions end this week, and instructors will be responsible for the Archivum data entry for courses that remain undone. Departments are encouraged to discontinue course that are no longer taught.
- Course Content Quality Review Form (Mlynarek)

 Dr, Mlynarek presented his plan for a simplified form, one that should take no more than 15 minutes to complete. He will distribute this form for testing by volunteers from the committee at or before the October meeting.

7. New Business

Fall admission

After discussing the MHA fall admission only policy (above), the committee engaged in a discussion of a fall admission policy for all programs. The general consensus was that this would be good in the future, but not at present because of enrollment issues (numbers of students), and uncertainty about data regarding the differences in quality (GRE/GPS scores) between fall and spring admitted students.

Cheating and plagiarism

The committee discussed cheating at some length. Several faculty have witnessed extensive, and fairly brazen cheating. The general consensus was that cheating has increased. Various methods of dealing with cheating were discussed, including dismissal of students from a class in real time if cheating is observed by an instructor, and this action was generally perceived favorably by the committee. There seems to be a USF policy that supports this action. Dr. Zgibor volunteered to construct a statement on cheating for the committee to consider.
