The meeting was called to order at 12:00 pm. Unless otherwise noted, all votes were unanimous.

# 1. Approval of the Minutes from the Meeting of 8/2/17

2. General Discussion Items (Mlynarek / Perrin)

- New student representative (Mlynarek) Dr. Mlynarek introduced the new student member, Joannie Bewa, and MPH student in CFH.
- Curriculum Specialist (Perrin) Dr. Perrin introduced Dr. Melanie Wicinski, the recently hired curriculum specialist. Dr. Wicinski will be an additional administration member of the committee.
- Curriculum process (Mlynarek) Dr. Mlynarek reminded the committee of the need to complete the concentration and syllabus changes to comply with BOG requirements and CEPH requirements, respectively.
- Dual degrees changing to concurrent degrees (Perrin)

Dr. Perrin informed the committee that the University had discontinued all dual degrees. She explained the new Catalog language concerning concurrent degrees. Obtaining a concurrent degree will be similar to the dual degree process. The specific catalog language defining concurrent degrees was emailed to all EC members.

### 3. Continuing Items (Mlynarek / Perrin)

• Course quality content evaluation

Dr. Mlynarek presented the simplified form for course content quality review and asked the primary EC members to use the form to evaluate one of their own courses, and provide comment. This form is part 1 of the review process and part 2 will be developed and will include assessing this form and determining levels of appropriate follow up. This form was emailed to all EC members.

• Online process

New course or substantive change moving a course form campus to online or other online requirement, needs justification statement. The EC tracking form was revised to include a space for a brief justification for any online new courses, online courses undergoing substantive change, or courses being converted from campus to online. For any of the above changes related to online courses, ETA will send a link to an additional form that will need to be completed so that the ETA time commitment can be estimated. These changes will then be evaluated by administration and scheduled based on priority. The revised EC tracking form was emailed to the committee.

- BOG Required Updates (Greer) Ms. Greer explained she has received most of the new formats. The USF catalog will not contain any elective details. We have asked Graduate Studies if we can put the elective courses on our POS and are waiting to hear back. This could potentially affect Archivum and advising.
- Course terminations (Greer) Many of the course terminations that were submitted are part of concentrations as electives or required courses. I have not checked certificates yet. I may be contacting departments to clarify as I review each course. Dr. Mlynarek wants to wait till October to review all course terminations at one time.
