# Program Director (PD)

The program director, as the leader of the program, must serve as a role model to residents in addition to fulfilling the technical aspects of the role. As residents are expected to demonstrate compassion, integrity, and respect for others, they must be able to look to the program director as an exemplar. It is of utmost importance, therefore, that the program director model outstanding professionalism, high quality patient care, educational excellence, and a scholarly approach to work. The program director creates an environment where respectful discussion is welcome, with the goal of continued improvement of the educational experience.

#### Associate/Assistant Program Director

Associate program directors (APDs) are faculty who assist the program director in the administrative and clinical oversight of the educational program.

#### Site Director

The Site Director, in collaboration with the Program Director (PD), is the official at the participating site who is responsible for supervising and overseeing resident education at that location. The Site Director, in collaboration with the PD, is generally responsible for ensuring that supervising faculty are fulfilling their responsibilities to provide education and supervision to residents and that ongoing evaluation of supervisors, residents, and the site are conducted. Core faculty members are critical to the success of resident education. They support the program leadership in developing, implementing, and assessing curriculum and in assessing residents' progress toward achievement of

competence in the specialty. Core faculty members should be selected for their broad knowledge of and involvement in the program, permitting them to effectively evaluate the program, including completion of the annual ACGME Faculty Survey.

# Program Administrator (PA)

The Program Coordinator has responsibility for assisting the Program Director with the day-to-day administration of the training program. The coordinator reports to the Program Director and the Office of Graduate Medical Education and functions as a liaison between the Office of Graduate Medical Education, other departments, residents/fellows, and the Program Director. In some departments, the coordinator is also responsible for supervision of other department staff working for the training program.
