Title: Educational Resources Devoted to Clinical Informatics Policy	GME-401
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Scope: Applies to the University of South Florida Morsani College of Medicine (“USF MCOM”) Accreditation Council for Graduate Medical Education (“ACGME”) Clinical Informatics Fellowship Program.

Background: The ACGME mandates that sponsoring institutions must have an institutional policy governing the educational resources committed to the Clinical Informatics fellowship that ensures collaboration among the multiple disciplines and professions involved in educating fellows [Clinical Informatics program requirement I.B.1.b)].

Policy: USF MCOM sponsors a single Clinical Informatics fellowship program under the Department of Internal Medicine. Clinical Informatics uses a multidisciplinary approach to analyzing, designing, implementing, and evaluating information and communication systems to improve patient care, enhance access to care, advance individual and population health outcomes, and strengthen the clinician-patient relationship.

The Designated Institutional Official (“DIO”), Core Program Director, Fellowship Program Director and the Graduate Medical Education Committee (“GMEC”) monitor educational resources committed to the Clinical Informatics fellowship through the Annual Program Evaluation Review and the Annual ACGME Survey of Residents’ Educational and Clinical Experiences to ensure that program and institution are meeting the ACGME requirements as described above.
