Getting Started – USF and USF Health

- USF Onboarding
- Get systems access according to assigned duties
 - Health email account
 - USF NetID
 - ARC Registration
 - Internal Form system
 - Hint: if you will be creating Internal Forms on behalf of your PI then CRAN access should be requested
 - The system is being redesigned and training will begin this month - register through TRAIN



Getting Started – USF OCR

- Get systems access according to assigned duties, cont.
 - ClinCard
 - Merge CTMS Investigator
 - OCR SharePoint PI Protocol Library



COMMUNICABLE DISEASE SCREENING & PREVENTION CERTIFICATION

Applicable Staff

- Required for all employees working where there is contact with patients and/or exposure to blood or body fluids
- If you will have face-to-face patient contact and/or will be involved in direct patient care, this screening is required
- Patient contact will not be permitted until the communicable disease screening is complete.

Timeframe for Completion

- Within the first two weeks of employment
- Annual Tuberculin Skin Testing (TST) will be required during your employment
- Annual influenza vaccination is highly encouraged
- Affiliates may have additional requirements for research credentialing at their facility



How

- Contact Medical Health Administration (974-3163) for a screening appointment

- Complete the Communicable Disease Screening Form and Prevention Certification Form
- Provide documentation of immunizations: Hep B, MMR, Varicella, Td, Tdap and influenza or titers will be drawn
- No cost immunizations are provided to staff based on titer results

ROLE-BASED TRAINING

Applicable Staff

- Safety: Back to Basics is required for all employees working in clinical areas or other areas where there is contact with patients and/or exposure to blood or bodily fluids
- Privacy in Research is required for all employees involved in human subject research
- Reducing the Risk covers medical malpractice and risk management issues and was developed by the USF Self-Insurance Program

Timeframe for Completion

- All required modules must be completed within 10 business days of hire date
- Training should be repeated annually

- Complete all of the modules within the course “Safety: Back to Basics” including the post tests

 - OSHA Bloodborne Pathogen (BBP) Education
 - Preventing Occupational Exposure to Bloodborne Pathogens
 - Selecting and Using Personal Protective Equipment

How, cont.

- Complete the course “Privacy in Research”
- Complete all of the modules within the course “Reducing the Risk” including the quizzes
- Print the Certificates of Completion and file with your site’s training records



USF HEALTH PROFESSIONAL INTEGRITY & COMPLIANCE

Applicable Staff

- Professional Integrity, Compliance and Information Security training is required of all faculty, residents/fellows, students, staff and other members of the USF Health community



Timeframe for Completion

- All required modules must be completed within 10 business days of hire date
- Training should be repeated annually

- This course includes the following modules:
 - Professional Integrity at USF Health
 - False Claims Acts and USF Health Standards
 - Professional Compliance - This course is chosen by Role. Select “Research staff with duties related to human subjects, patients or PHI”
 - HIPAA Compliance - This course is chosen by Role. Select “Research staff with duties related to human subjects, patients or PHI”
 - Computer & Information Security
- Print the certificate of completion and file with your site’s training records

Unlawful Harassment Prevention

USF REQUIRED TRAINING

Applicable Staff

- The USF Required Training course is comprised of training that USF Administration has determined to be required of all faculty and staff

Timeframe for Completion

- All required modules must be completed within 10 business days of hire date
- Training should be repeated annually

HUMAN SUBJECTS PROTECTION EDUCATION

Applicable Staff

- All faculty, staff and students directly involved in the conduct of clinical research
- This includes individuals who:
 - collect or enter data
 - conduct study procedures (including informed consent) or interventions with human subjects
 - use or have access to private information that can be linked to research subjects

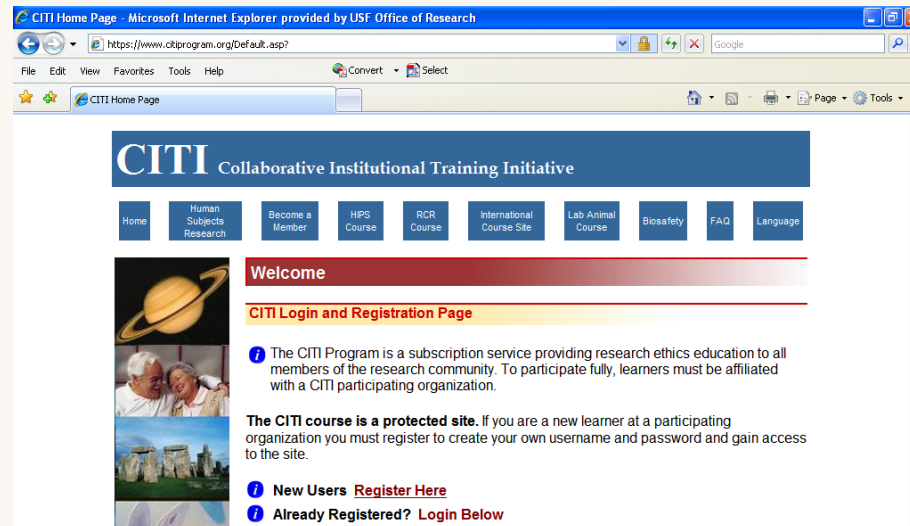
Timeframe for Completion

- Prior to engaging in the conduct of clinical research with human subjects and every two years thereafter

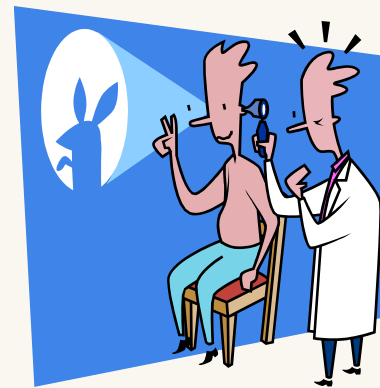
How, cont.

- Complete the Biomedical Investigators and Key Personnel – Basic Course if this is the first time taking HSP education
- Complete the Biomedical Investigators and Key Personnel – Refresher Course if the Basic Course has already been completed
- Print the certificate of completion and file with your site's training records

GOOD CLINICAL PRACTICE (GCP)

Applicable Staff

- All faculty, staff and students directly involved in the conduct of clinical research
- This course is intended for use by research personnel involved in conducting drug, device or biologic studies



Timeframe for Completion

- Prior to engaging in the conduct of clinical research with human subjects
- While not mandatory at this time, it is recommended that this course be completed every two years

**USF RIC BIOSAFETY COURSE:
*COMPREHENSIVE GUIDE TO
SHIPPING INFECTIOUS
SUBSTANCES AND DIAGNOSTIC
SPECIMENS***

Applicable Staff

- All USF staff who ship and/or receive potentially biohazardous materials
- The DOT defines hazardous material as substances that are capable of posing an unreasonable risk to health, safety, and property when transported in commerce
- This includes diagnostic specimens, infectious agents, biological products, and dry ice

Timeframe for Completion

- Within 90 days of hire into a position that requires the shipping/ receipt of biohazardous materials and biannually thereafter

- The training is completed on an individual basis and is an interactive, computer-based, self-paced training program
- Average allotted time to complete training is about 2 to 3 hours

How, cont.

- Testing is conducted at 3702 Spectrum Blvd., University Technology Center, Suite 155
- There is an open-book exam at the end of the training and you must score 85% or better to earn your certificate
- The training is good for two years
- File your certificate of completion with your site's training records

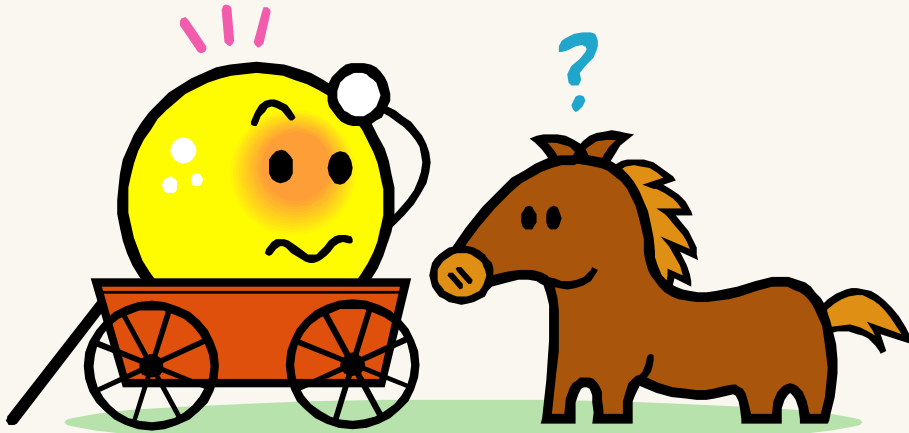
RESPONSIBLE CONDUCT OF RESEARCH

Applicable Staff

- Effective January 4, 2010 the National Science Foundation (NSF) requires that all undergraduate and graduate students, as well as post-doctoral research fellows, who are submitting new proposals for NSF funding receive training in the Responsible Conduct of Research (RCR)
- Effective January 25, 2010, the National Institutes of Health (NIH) also adopted and expanded this requirement to include scholars

Timeframe for Completion

- Prior to submission of NSF proposal and/or prior to being appointed to an NIH funded grant

- CITI offers RCR training for biomedical sciences, social and behavioral sciences and other disciplines
- NIH specifies that 8 hours of training must be completed every 4 years. A substantive amount of this training must be in person.
