Focus Groups & Interviews

- Focus groups/Interviews were conducted with state and local teams (NewTown pending) to understand the community of focus, their partners, and strategies towards reaching the goals of ECCS.
- Key Takeaways:
 - Poverty, housing instability, and violence are the leading areas of concern.
 - Community agencies and members are willing to provide assistance in improving the well-being of children and families in the community.

PARTNER Tool Survey


- The measurement of collaboration among agencies was completed by the evaluation team using the Program to Analyze, Record, and Track Networks to Enhance Relationships (PARTNER) Tool survey by linking:
 - connectedness
 - trust level
 - resource exchange
 - Also measures perceptions of leadership, shared vision, and progress of the initiative.

State Leadership Team


- Florida ECCS state partners most commonly identified their level of collaboration with one another as "cooperative" or "coordinated".
- Half of the state partners reported improving services for children and families in high-need communities as the top most important potential outcome of the project.




PARTNER Tool Survey

New Town Success Zone

- NTSZ most commonly identified their level of collaboration in interactions with community partners as cooperative or coordinated.
- Improving services for children and families in high-need communities and reducing health disparities are the top two most important outcomes of the project.
