#### What Is It?

Preeclampsia is a serious disease related to high blood pressure. It can happen to any pregnant woman.

#### Risks to You

- Seizures
- Stroke
- Organ damage
- Death

#### **Risks to Your Baby**

- · Premature birth
- Death

### Signs of Preeclampsia



Stomach pain



Headache



Feeling nauseous; throwing up



Seeing spot



Swelling in your hands and face



Gaining more than 5 pounds in a week

#### What Should You Do?

Call your doctor right away. Finding preeclampsia early is important for you and your baby.


