

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


#### Fig 1. Intention to Provide MOM out of <u>all eligible VLBW infants</u>



#### Fig 2. MOM pumped volume ≥500 ml/day on DOL 14



### New Goal Lines

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
S of all VLBW infants having ≥50% of feeding volume comprised of MOM on Initial Disp. Goal is 50% (previously 60%)







# Fig 4. % of infants having ≥50% of feeding volume comprised of MOM on initial disposition



In NICU families who intend to breastfeed, are the first oral feeding attempts reserved for direct breastfeeding during the NICU stay?










#### Fig 7. Non-nutritive BF session documented










# Fig 6. Nutritive BF session at within 7 days of infant's initial disposition
