What's Wrong With This Picture

Do you know what hazard is occurring in this picture? Read below to find out.

An employee is using a hand held grinder for floor grinding inside a structure for more than four hours. This will expose the employee to respirable crystalline silica above the permissible exposure limit.

The OSHA standard regarding respirable crystalline silica in <u>Table 1 Specified Exposure Control Methods</u> When working with Materials Containing Crystalline Silica 1926.1153 (c) (1) (xii) states that an employee using a hand held grinder for uses other than mortar removal must use a grinder equipped with a commercially available shroud and dust collection system. The tool must be operated in accordance with the manufacturer's instructions to minimize dust emissions. The dust collector must provide 25 cubic feet per minute (cfm) or greater of airflow per inch of wheel diameter and have a filter with 99% or greater efficiency and a cyclonic pre-separator or filler cleaning mechanism. When the grinder is used indoors for more than four hours the employer must wear respiratory protection with an assigned protection factor (APF) of at least 10. This is typically an N95 or P100 filter face air purifying respirator. If the equipment is properly, the employer is in compliance with 1926.1153 and not further monitoring is necessary.

However, the employer must develop a silica exposure control plan and have a written respirator program complies with 1910.134. Additionally, the employer must provide medical monitoring to this employee if the task occurs more than 30 days per calendar year.
