What Is It?

Preeclampsia is a serious disease related to high blood pressure. It can happen to any pregnant woman.

Risks to You

- Seizures
- Stroke
- Organ damage
- Death

Risks to Your Baby

- Premature birth
- Death

Signs of Preeclampsia



Stomach pain



Headaches



Feeling nauseous;
throwing up



Seeing spots



Swelling in your
hands and face



Gaining more than
5 pounds in a week

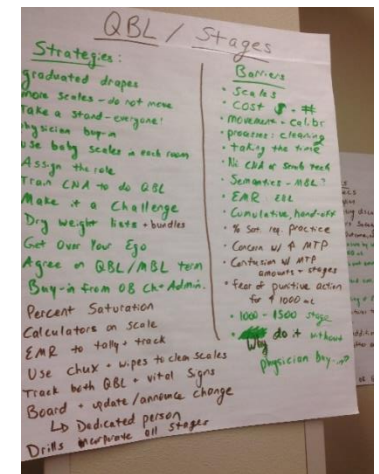
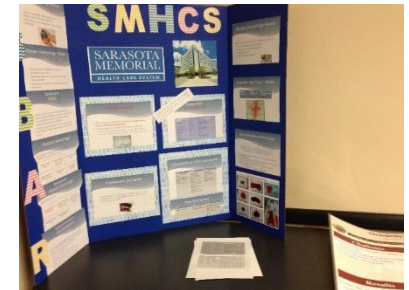
