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Agency Updates

- Effective July 11, 2016 – Agency implemented system-wide policy changes (i.e., unbundled payment) to support the Agency’s goal of improving birth outcomes.
- Agency issued a [provider alert](#) clarifying LARC Inpatient FFS Reimbursement in August 2017.



IPP LARC Reimbursement for FFS

- Medicaid reimburses immediate postpartum (IPP) placement of LARCs separate from the inpatient hospital labor and delivery Diagnosis Related Group (DRG) payments.
- Medicaid health plans have the flexibility to negotiate mutually agreed upon reimbursement arrangements with their network providers.
- Providers rendering services via FFS can seek reimbursement for LARCs by utilizing the device insertion and removal procedure codes. *See CPT and HCPCS codes on next 2 slides.*



CPT Codes: Device Insertion/Removal

CPT CODE	DESCRIPTION
11981	Insertion, non-biodegradable drug delivery implants
11982	Removal, non-biodegradable drug delivery implants
11983	Removal with reinsertion, non-biodegradable drug delivery implant
58300	Insertion of IUD
58301	Removal of IUD
