

Florida Levels of Maternal Care Year 3 Impact

July 2025

Since 2022, the Florida Perinatal Quality Collaborative (FPQC) has supported hospitals to obtain Levels of Maternal Care (LOMC) verification. Florida's model follows the ACOG and Society for Maternal Fetal Medicine guidelines. Verification is conducted by The Joint Commission (TJC) using a standardized framework.

39 verified hospitals

38% of maternity hospitals

52% of Florida births

Level IV: **10** hospitals Level III: 7 hospitals Level II: 13 hospitals

Level I: 9 hospitals

- 3. TJC site visit within 90 days
- 4. FPQC evaluation survey
- 5. Reverification visit after 3 years

- Limited Year 4 funding available to hospitals pursuing verification
- 12 hospitals have applications in progress
- LOMC standards align with FPQC PROMPT and OHI 2.0 initiatives
- ED-EMS partners are interested in LOMC verification to improve patient transfers
