











Yearly prevalence of HDP among delivery admissions






FPQC Hypertension in Pregnancy (HIP) 2015-2017 Percent Treated Within 1 hour with Persistent Severe Hypertension

Blood Pressure Cuffs

At the kickoff, FPQC distributed **5,000** wrist cuffs to 61 hospitals, along with new educational tools to teach patients how to use them.


Our goal was to help hospitals develop the practice of sending women with hypertensive disorders home with a cuff IN HAND.

According to our recent survey, 83% of PROMPT hospitals are distributing cuffs to some or all of their patients at discharge.

Today, we will be distributing another **3,400** cuffs to support these efforts.



Patients with BP Cuff in Hand Before Discharge








40 Florida LOMC Verified Hospitals

LOMC Progress Update

13 hospitals have applications in progress

If all hospitals in progress achieve verification, <u>63%</u> of Florida births will occur at verified hospitals

Including the total number of currently interested hospitals, LOMC has the potential to cover <u>74%</u> of Florida births
