

Since joining the University of Florida College of Medicine faculty in 1988, Dr. Williams has been active in improving infertility services for infertile couples in Florida. In addition to providing clinical services, he is involved in basic research for hormonal actions and prevention of postoperative scar tissue. Dr. Williams teaches medical students and OB/GYN resident doctors at the University of Florida Clinics and Shands Hospital, as well as teaching OB/GYN practitioners in Florida about the latest advances in endocrinology, infertility and advanced laparoscopic surgery.

Dr. Williams attended undergraduate and medical school at the University of North Carolina in Chapel Hill. After graduation from medical school with honors in 1979, he obtained residency training in Obstetrics and Gynecology at the Medical University of South Carolina in Charleston. Following residency, Dr. Williams served in the Air Force for three years practicing OB/GYN at Chanute AFB, IL. While in the Air Force, he obtained the rank of Major and became the Chief of OB/GYN. Dr. Williams left the Air Force to receive subspecialty fellowship training in Reproductive Endocrinology and Infertility at the University of Louisville. Dr. Williams is Board certified in Obstetrics and Gynecology, and is also Board certified in Reproductive Endocrinology and Infertility. He is a Fellow of the American College of Obstetrics and Gynecology and is an active member of the American Society for Reproductive Medicine (previously the American Fertility Society) among numerous other medical societies. In 2008 he was elected as President of the Society of Assisted Reproductive Technology for 2010-2011. Since 1998 Dr. Williams has been selected annually as one of the "Best Doctors in America," as featured on 60 Minutes, USA Today, The New York Times and other national media.



William N. Spellacy, M.D.

Professor and Residency Program Director

William Nelson Spellacy was born in St. Paul, Minnesota and attended the University of Minnesota for his undergraduate education and medical school, graduating with Alpha Omega Alpha honors. He also completed his residency in Obstetrics and Gynecology there.

His professional academic career began as a faculty member at the University of Minnesota, from which he moved to the University of Miami and advanced to the academic rank of Professor. While still in his thirties, he was appointed Professor and Chairman of OB/GYN at the University of Florida School of Medicine, where he remained for almost a decade. In 1979, Dr. Spellacy moved to Chicago to head the Department of OB/GYN at the University of Illinois. Under his leadership, the department achieved national prominence in research, education and patient care. In 1988, he returned to Florida to become Chairman of the Department of OB/GYN at the University Of South Florida Morsani College Of Medicine. In 2002 he resigned the chairmanship and has continued as Professor and Residency Director.

In addition to being chairman of three academic OB/GYN departments, he was one of the main architects of the design and formation of the original subspecialty of Maternal Fetal Medicine. His contributions to medical literature have been impressive in both quality and quantity, with over 500 peer reviewed articles, 80 book chapters, and 10 books resulting from his efforts. He has been the recipient of numerous honors and recognitions, including being elected to the Institute of Medicine of the National Academy of Sciences, one of the highest honors in medicine. He has served as President of the Society for Gynecologic Investigation (SGI), the Association of Professors of Gynecology and Obstetrics (APGO), and the Society of Maternal Fetal Medicine (SMFM). He was also a director of the American Board of Obstetrics and Gynecology (ABOG). While his interests are varied, he has always placed an emphasis on resident and student education, and research in areas of Women Health.
