PGY 4

Goals:

- 1. The resident will demonstrate understanding of the techniques for management of plastic surgery of the breast.
- 2. The resident will become competent in the management of skin and soft tissue malignancies.

PATIENT CARE

- a. Able to select which technique of wound care is most appropriate.
- b. Learn to treat complex wound management, both operative and non-operative, to treat wounds and defects of the upper and lower extremities, trunk, head and neck.
- c. Learn the indications for choosing a particular reconstructive technique that is most appropriate and demonstrate the surgical techniques covered during the rotation.
- d. Demonstrate understanding of the technique for management of plastic surgery of the breast and give supporting reasons as to why it is the appropriate choice.
- e. Demonstrate understanding of the technique for management of breast reduction, breast augmentation, mastopexy including the indications for each technique and be able to choose appropriate technique/timing.
- f. Able to prescribe medication for post-operative pain after surgery.
- g. Able to provide post-operative instructions and provide a mechanism for patients to address post-operative problems.
- h. Demonstrate proficiency in diagnosis, pre-operative, operative, and non-operative care.

MEDICAL KNOWLEDGE

- a. Learn to treat complex wounds, both operative and non-operative, of the upper and lower extremities, trunk, head and neck.
- b. Learn the indications for choosing a particular technique that is most appropriate and demonstrate the surgical techniques covered during the rotation.
- c. Demonstrate understanding of the technique for management of breast reduction, breast augmentation, mastopexy including the indications for each technique and be able to choose the appropriate technique.
- d. Demonstrate appreciation for pre-operative evaluation and surgical planning for the management of neoplasms of the head and neck.
- e. Demonstrate knowledge in recognizing and treating complications timely and appropriately.

PRACTICE BASED LEARNING/IMPROVEMENT

- a. Demonstrate understanding of the technique for management of plastic surgery of the breast and give supporting reasons as to why it is the appropriate choice.
- b. Participate in the performance improvement process including assessment of his/her outcomes.
- c. Able to critically review medical literature and participate in evidence-based discussions that may lead to improvements in the practice of surgery.

INTERPERSONAL AND COMMUNICATION SKILLS

- Demonstrate an appreciation for the psychosocial concerns of the post-mastectomy patient.
- b. Communicate clearly with patients, their families, and the medical staff.
- c. Demonstrate effective communication with all members of the operating room team.
- d. Communicate effectively with patients and their families and be able to discuss risks, benefits, and alternatives.
- e. Demonstrate knowledge, skills, proficiency at communicating and coordinating care with multiple discipline specialties.

PROFESSIONALISM

- a. Be aware of emotional issues associated with various surgical procedures.
- b. Demonstrate involvement in the post-operative care of patients and create a positive public image.
- c. Demonstrate the ability to maintain his/her composure during stressful clinical situations.
- d. Acknowledge the anxieties of patients and their families and answer questions and allay anxiety.
- e. Be aware of and sensitive to a variety of cultures and religious beliefs.
- f. Adhere to the highest ethical standards and the principle "the needs of the patient come first."
- g. Gain and utilize skills for discussing and communicating critical issues/problems.

SYSTEMS-BASED PRACTICE

- a. Demonstrate appreciation for pre-operative evaluation and surgical planning for the management of neoplasms of the head and neck.
- b. Be aware of peri-operative costs of surgery in a comprehensive manner.
- c. Understand when it is appropriate to seek help through appropriate consultation with colleagues.
- d. Demonstrate understanding and appropriate utilization of the electronic patient information system.
- e. Understand methods to practice cost-effective health care while providing the highest quality of care for their patients.
