Goals:

- 1. The resident will demonstrate understanding of the techniques for management of plastic surgery of the breast.

- d. Become competent in demonstrating appreciation of the concerns in the management of both operative and non-operative aesthetic patients to include rhytidectomy, rhinoplasty, blepharoplasty, browlift, chemical peel, dermbarasion, and laser resurfacing.
- e. Demonstrate competency in the technique of aesthetic surgery of the trunk and extremities which include liposuction and body contouring surgery.
- f. Learn the indications for choosing a particular technique for each type of reconstructive surgery.

- h. Become competent in scientific and technical use of the laser for the treatment of cosmetic patients and congenital and acquired conditions.

- k. Learn the indications and techniques of aesthetic surgery of the face, breast, trunk and extremities.
- I. Learn the pre-operative work-up, staging, surgical management, and post-operative surveillance for treating skin and soft tissue malignancies.
- m. Demonstrate knowledge in recognizing and treating complications timely and appropriately.
