UNDERSTANDING BLEEDING AFTER BIRTH (POSTPARTUM HEMORRHAGE) We want you to understand what happened after your Delivery, so you can feel informed and take good care of yourself.			
What happened	After your baby was born, you lost more blood than usual. This is called a postpartum hemorrhage which means heavy bleeding after delivery.		
Why it matters	Losing too much blood can make your body feel weak and tired. It can also affect how your organs work if not treated quickly.		
What was done to help	The healthcare team acted quickly to stop the bleeding. You were given medications used to stop heavy bleeding. The following procedures were performed: ☐ ☐		
Blood Transfusion	You (Select "received" or "did not receive":34678) a blood transfusion.		
What to expect	You may feel more tired than usual. You may need to take iron or other medications as prescribed by your doctor to help you to feel better. We will give you some written instructions about how to take care of yourself and what emergency symptoms to look for when you return home.
