- The history, functions, and financing of health services relate to careers in public health, clinical care, and health administration.
- Health services interventions at the individual level impact population health status, especially issues related to access, cost, and quality of medical care.

Course Description:

An introduction to health services; providing an overview of important components of the U.S. health care system, health policy, funding sources, and comparisons with other developed nations.

Course Objectives:

- 1. Understand the defining characteristics of U.S. healthcare system and basic framework the delivery medical care in the U.S.
- 2. Distinguish the roles of various levels and branches of government in the United States
- 3. Describe the magnitude of the U.S. government's role in healthcare financing
- 4. Explain various healthcare payment models utilized in the U.S. healthcare system
- 5. Compare characteristics of the U.S. health system to the systems of other countries
- 6. Using an understanding of multiple determinants of health, describe how health services research is helping to reorient the U.S. health system from a medical model to a population health model
- 7. Define the public health system structure, responsibilities, and the Ten Essential Public Health Services
- 8. Relate importance of trust in public health and the challenges in health communication

Course Structure:

The course is 100% web-based and is conducted via the USF Canvas portal. No campus class meetings are required. Course activities will be available on a weekly basis and will include PowerPoint lectures and handouts, textbook readings, and individual and group assignments. All additional readings will be available online within Canvas; students will not need to purchase an additional reading packet. Individual assignments will be based on readings, lectures, videos, and podcasts - all available on Canvas. Group assignments will involve discussing current health care issues in groups of approximately ten students. Discussions will be conducted in Canvas.
